Task 2 – Web Page

You are going to create a web page and edit a stylesheet for Super-Disk-Sales. Many of the people who will view the web page have very slow internet connection. The web page and stylesheet must work in any browser. All colour codes must be in hexadecimal. Make sure that your stylesheet contains no HTML.

- Create a new folder called **SDS_html**
- Locate the following files and store them in your *SDS_html* folder.

SDSdisks.jpg**SSD.txt****SSDstyle.css**

- Open the file **SDSdisks.jpg** in a suitable application. Reflect the image horizontally. Save this image as **disk1.jpg** in your *SDS_html* folder.
 - Rotate the image *disk1.jpg* 90 degrees clockwise. Save this image as **disk2.jpg** in your *SDS_html* folder.
 - Crop the image *disk2.jpg* so that all the solid state drive is visible with an equal amount of red background on each side. This image must be square. Do **not** distort the image. The hard disk drive must **not** be visible.
 - Save this image as **disk3.jpg** in your *SDS_html* folder.
 - Resize the image *disk3.jpg* to become 600 × 600 pixels. Save this image as **disk4.jpg** in your *SDS_html* folder.

- 4 • Display the contents of your *SDS_html* folder showing the folder name, image dimensions, all file names, file extensions and file sizes. [1]

This web page must work in all browsers and will have a table structure as shown:

- Each table cell is identified with a letter and all dimensions are in pixels. The letters and dimensions shown in the table must **not** appear on your final web page.
- Table borders and gridlines **must** appear on the final web page.

followed by your name, centre number and candidate number
- Set this text as style h3.

- 12 • Attach the stylesheet **SSDstyle.css** to this web page.
- Save your web page.

- 13 • Open the stylesheet *SSDstyle.css* in a suitable software package. Edit this stylesheet to meet these specifications:

h1, h2, h3	font set to Arial or if this is not available Helvetica or if neither of these fonts are available then display the default sans-serif font
	font colour set to the hexadecimal number 361215
	centre aligned text
h1	30 points high
h2	14 points high
h3	20 points high
all table cells	padding set to 15 pixels no collapsed borders
background colour	blue component set to the hexadecimal number 99 and ff for both the red and green components

Task 3 – Spreadsheet

You are going to prepare a spreadsheet for Super-Disk-Sales. This company makes and sells storage devices. The company will use a spreadsheet to compare some of the Solid State Drives that they sell. All prices are in Euros which must be displayed with 2 decimal places.

- 14 • Open and examine the files **SSDmanufacturer.csv** and **SSD.csv** in a spreadsheet package.
- In the file *SSD.csv* spreadsheet insert 2 new rows at the top.
 - Enter in cell A1 the text:
SDS – SSD price per gigabyte
 - Merge cells A1 to G1
 - Format the merged cell A1 to have a white, 30 point, serif font on a red background.
 - Format the text in row 3 to be a red, 18 point, sans-serif font.
 - Format the top of the spreadsheet to look like this:

- Save this spreadsheet with the filename **SDS_SSD_** and your centre number and candidate number, e.g. SDS_SSD_ZZ999_9999 [9]
- 15 • Place your name, centre number and candidate number, centre aligned in the header.
- Place the text:
Created on: followed by an automated date, then a space and then the automated time, left aligned in the footer. [2]
- 16 • In cell C4 use a function to look up the manufacturer's name. Use the *Mcode* column for the lookup value and the external file *SSDmanufacturer.csv* for the array. [5]
- 17 • In cell G4 use a formula to calculate the price per gigabyte for this drive.
- Round this value down to 2 decimal places. [5]
- 18 • Replicate the functions used in steps 16 and 17 for each drive. [1]

- 19 • Apply appropriate formatting to rows 4 to 108 of the spreadsheet. [1]
- 20 • Save your spreadsheet.
- Print the entire spreadsheet showing the formulae. Make sure:
 - it is in landscape orientation
 - the row and column headings are displayed
 - the contents of all cells are fully visible.

- 21 • Print the entire spreadsheet showing the values. Make sure the:
 - printout fits on a single page wide and is two pages tall
 - contents of all cells are fully visible with no split words.

- 22 • Extract only the drives made by Samsung or OZT that cost under 200 Euros with more than 240GB of storage capacity. [3]
- 23 • Sort the extract into ascending order of manufacturer then ascending order of price. [1]
- Print the extract showing the values. Make sure:
 - the printout fits on a single page
 - the contents of all required cells are fully visible.
